



Before being appointed by the President of Brazil, Dilma Rousseff, as head of the Olympic Public Authority, which will coordinate all investments for the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio, Mr. Meirelles was the Governor of the Central Bank of Brazil, from 2003 to 2011. Previously, Mr. Meirelles was President of BankBoston and of FleetBoston's Corporate and Global Bank. He joined BankBoston in 1974 and became its President and Regional Manager in Brazil in 1984. Later, he was appointed President and COO in 1996, and President of FleetBoston's Corporate and Global Bank in 1999, following the merger of the two institutions. He was also a member of the Board of Directors of several companies, including Raytheon Corporation, Bestfoods, Champion International, BankBoston Corporation and FleetBoston Financial. Mr. Meirelles was a member of the Advisory Boards of the Harvard Kennedy School of Government, Sloan School of Management of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and Carroll School of Management of the Boston College. He was also a member of the Board of Trustees of the New England Conservatory of Music and of the Institute of Contemporary Arts of Boston. In 2002, Mr. Meirelles was elected a Congressman in Brazil. In 2007, Euromoney Magazine chose him the "Central Banker of the year".
