He has served on the Olin faculty since 1990. Students have given him the Reid Teaching Award eight times since 2001. He was chosen the Marcile and James Reid Professor for 1996-1997. Gupta's research has been published in leading academic journals in the United States and abroad. He has served on several editorial boards and he is a frequent speaker at research workshops and conferences worldwide. He has served on the boards of Dance St. Louis and the Consortium for Graduate Study in Management. He is currently on the board of Junior Achievement and Variety the Children's Charity of St. Louis, on the academic advisory board for the World Trade Center.
