Born in Ouro Fino, Minas Gerais, he holds a bachelor's degree in geography from Federal University of Juiz de Fora and a Master of Arts in demography from University of Pennsylvania, USA.

He is a retired professor from Federal University of Minas Gerais, where he was director of Center for Regional Development and Planning (CEDEPLAR) (1987-1988) and coordinator of Graduate Program in Economics (1982-1983). He was a Tinker Visiting Professor at Lyndon B. Johnson School of Public Affairs at University of Texas at Austin, USA (2005).

In the government of Minas Gerais, he was President of Banco de Desenvolvimento de Minas Gerais S.A. (BDMG), Secretary of Transport and Public Works (2006), Secretary of Planning and General Coordination (1991-1994). He was also Chairman of the Board of Directors of BEMGE, CREDIREAL, and BDMG, state banks of MG.

In Federal Government, he was Minister of Planning and Budget (1988-1999) and Minister of Labor (1995-1998), Chairman of National Privatization Council (1998-1999), and member of National Monetary Council (1998-1999).

He was Vice President of Planning and Administration at Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) (1999-2004) and Vice President of the Board of Directors of the Inhotim Institute (2011-2015).

He has published books and articles on economic growth and population growth, labor market, and public policies.

He is an associate professor at Fundação Dom Cabral (FDC) and a member of Economic Policy Council of Federation of Industries of Minas Gerais (FIEMG).
