Subramanian Rangan holds a PhD in Political Economy from Harvard University and an MBA in Business from the MIT Sloan School of Management. He participates in executive programs in the areas of Strategy and International Management, is an Associate Professor at INSEAD in the areas of Strategy and Management, and at Fundação Dom Cabral in the area of Strategy. Additionally, he is a Member of the Board of Trustees and Associate of Fundação Dom Cabral.

His research and teaching revolve around the dilemmas of strategy and management of multinational companies. He has been awarded the following prizes: Eldridge Haynes Prize from the Academy of International Business for the best essay in International Business, 1998; Outstanding Professor Award for the MBA course "Management and Global Strategy" at INSEAD, 1998; Best Dissertation Award from the Academy of International Business, offered by Richard N. Farmer, 1995; George S. Dively Fellow Award from the Center for Business and Government at Harvard University, 1991/1992. In 2010, his research won the Emerald Award for the top 50 papers in the management area.
