MINISTER OF BRAZIL'S FEDERAL **COURT OF ACCOUNTS**

Antonio Augusto Junho Anastasia was governor of Minas Gerais from March 31, 2010 until April 4, 2014, when he resigned the position to coordinate the Plan of Government of senator Aécio Neves to the Presidency and be available to bid for the Senate. Mr. Anastasia has had a distinguished career as a public servant in Minas Gerais, starting at the João Pinheiro Foundation, in 1984, as the Coordinator of the Administration Development Centre. In 1991, he became the President of the Foundation. Thereafter, he has been appointed Secretary of the State Department of Planning and Budget (2003/2006), State Department of Defence (2005/2006), State Department of Human Resources and Administration (1994), State Department of Culture (1994) and State Department of Planning and General Coordination (1991/1994), among others. During the Fernando Henrique Cardoso presidency, he served as Executive Secretary of the Labour (1995/1999) and Justice (1999/2001) Departments.

Anastasia was born on May 9th, 1961, in Belo Horizonte, Minas Gerais. He earned his bachelor's degree in Law in 1983 and a Master's degree in Administrative Law in 1990, both from the Federal University of Minas Gerais. He subsequently started, but did not finish, doctoral studies at that university as well, where he is an assistant professor.
